

The Minpins

The Minpins, Stroud Choral Society's children's choir, was created with the support of the Roald Dahl Literary Estate, Felicity Dahl, Roald's widow, and by a legacy left to Ruth Fraser by Barbara Parrott, her cousin who taught music to primary school children for many years. They are named after Roald's final book, in which the Minpins are a 'city of little people'. Felicity Dahl is Patron of this talented and enthusiastic group who are directed by Zoë Hynes.

In March 2017 The Minpins took on their biggest challenge yet, when they performed alongside the Stroud Choral Society in the world premiere of a specially commissioned work, The Pelicantata, a setting of Roald Dahl's book"The Giraffe and the Pelly and Me". They also premiered the specially adapted Children Choruses entitled 'Five Animal Choruses 'from ThePelicantata in March 2019. Last month The Minpins were very proud to premiere 'Pop Goes the Weasel! and Other Nursery Songs' Composed by Peter Ash, who also composed The Pelicantata as part of their 10th Anniversary concert.

The Minpins perform at least 4 times a year, on their own, with the youth choir and with the adult choir, Stroud Choral Society.

Stroud Choral Youth Choir (SCYC)

In September 2017, in order to accommodate children who had outgrown The Minpins, we branched out and formed a new Youth Choir, Stroud Choral Youth Choir (SCYC). SCYC perform up to 5 times a year at a variety of venues including an annual summer concert with the Stroud Choral Society. Currently comprising 24 talented young people, the choir would welcome any 'teens' with a passion for singing a variety of music, including classical, choral, spiritual and pop.

Zoë is a professional teacher whose enthusiasm for singing is infectious. She has been singing in choirs since the age of 9 and made the televised final of Sing out 2000 'as part of The University of the West of England's chamber choir. She joined the Stroud Choral Society in 2006 and has been an active choir member and soloist ever since. Zoë took the role of The Minpins Musical Director when they formed in 2015 and has enjoyed the challenge of establishing and shaping the choir to the high standard it is today. From September 2017 she has also taken on the running of the Stroud Choral Youth Choir. Zoë also runs the school choir at Nailsworth Primary School.

Nicola is local to the area having been a music scholar at the Cheltenham Ladies' College. She then went on to study music at The University of Birmingham. Nicola is a class music teacher and a visitinginstrumental (piano, violin andrecorder) teacher, accompanist and singer, travelling widely throughout the Cotswolds. She is also a violinist in The Cheltenham Symphony Orchestra and The Full Tone Orchestra. Nicola has been the accompanist for The Minpins and the Stroud Choral Youth Choir for the past eight years.
